Watch out, you shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture, declares the LORD.

²This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, proclaims about the shepherds who “tend to” my people: You are the ones who have scattered my flock and driven them away. You haven’t attended to their needs, so I will take revenge on you for the terrible things you have done to them, declares the LORD.

³I myself will gather the few remaining sheep from all the countries where I have driven them. I will bring them back to their pasture, and they will be fruitful and multiply.

⁴I will place over them shepherds who care for them. Then they will no longer be afraid or dread harm, nor will any be missing, declares the LORD.

⁵The time is coming, declares the LORD, when I will raise up a righteous descendant^[a] from David’s line, and he will rule as a wise king. He will do what is just and right in the land.

⁶During his lifetime, Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And his name will be The LORD Is Our Righteousness.^[b]

Colossians 1:11-20 Common English Bible (CEB)

¹¹by being strengthened through his glorious might so that you endure everything and have patience;

¹²and by giving thanks with joy to the Father. He made it so you could take part in the inheritance, in light granted to God’s holy people.

¹³He rescued us from the control of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of the Son he loves.

¹⁴He set us free through the Son and forgave our sins.

¹⁵The Son is the image of the invisible God, the one who is first over all creation,^[a]

¹⁶Because all things were created by him: both in the heavens and on the earth, the things that are visible and the things that are invisible. Whether they are thrones or powers, or rulers or authorities, all things were created through him and for him.

¹⁷He existed before all things, and all things are held together in him.

¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the one who is firstborn from among the dead^[b] so that he might occupy the first place in everything.

¹⁹Because all the fullness of God was pleased to live in him,

²⁰and he reconciled all things to himself through him—whether things on earth or in the heavens. He brought peace through the blood of his cross.

Luke 23:33-43 Common English Bible (CEB)

33 When they arrived at the place called The Skull, they crucified him, along with the criminals, one on his right and the other on his left.

34 Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they're doing." They drew lots as a way of dividing up his clothing.

35 The people were standing around watching, but the leaders sneered at him, saying, "He saved others. Let him save himself if he really is the Christ sent from God, the chosen one."

36 The soldiers also mocked him. They came up to him, offering him sour wine

37 and saying, "If you really are the king of the Jews, save yourself."

38 Above his head was a notice of the formal charge against him. It read "This is the king of the Jews."

39 One of the criminals hanging next to Jesus insulted him: "Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

40 Responding, the other criminal spoke harshly to him, "Don't you fear God, seeing that you've also been sentenced to die?"

41 We are rightly condemned, for we are receiving the appropriate sentence for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong."

42 Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

43 Jesus replied, "I assure you that today you will be with me in paradise."
